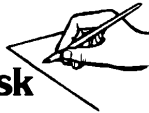


**From the Pastor's Desk**

**Question and Answer Forum with Fr. John**

**Dear Father,** I was wondering....Why are there so many Bibles today which differ from the Latin Vulgate version that we grew up with?

**Dear friend,** Thank you for your excellent question. The Council of Trent, in the sixteenth century, approved a Latin translation of the Old and New Testaments for use by the Catholic Church. However, the Council did not prohibit publication of the Bible in other languages and further translations of the Bible. In the twentieth century scholars tried to make new translations of the Bible because English continues to change as a living language, and because they wanted to translate ancient Hebrew and Greek words as precisely as possible. To be sure that a Bible is authorized by the Church look for **Nihil obstat** and **Imprimatur** on the front pages of the Bible.
