Question and Answer Forum with Fr. John

Dear Father, I was wondering... How does one become officially recognized by the church as a saint?

Dear friend, Thank you for your excellent question. Here are the steps in the process of canonization of a saint...

1. The local bishop investigates the life of the person to look for evidence of heroic virtue.
2. A group of theologians and Cardinals evaluate the candidate.
3. If the theologians and Cardinals approve they recommend the individual to the Pope who declares that he or she is venerable, which means they are a role model of Catholic virtue.
4. In the next step the pope beatifies the person. This step requires proof of a posthumous miracle through the intercession of the person. Martyrs may be beatified without proof of a miracle. Beatification means that the Blessed person may be honored by a particular group or in a particular region of the world.
5. Once there is verified proof of a second miracle through the intercession of the beatified he or she is canonized.
