In today's Gospel the Lord heals the sick and raises the dead, and He begs us to have faith and to trust him when we are in physical or spiritual need.

**Question and Answer Forum with Fr. John**

**Dear Father,** I was wondering... What is the origin of the Sign of the Cross?

**Dear friend,** Thank you for your interesting question. As you know we make the sign of the Cross to bless ourselves, and to bless others. It is always used to begin and end the Mass. The sign of the Cross has a rich and ancient history. In the year 200 Tertullian wrote..." We wear out our foreheads making the sign of the Cross. We trace an upright cross on the body while saying the trinitarian formula, " In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Before we listen to the Gospel we bless our foreheads, our lips and our heart. We ask God's blessing upon us. The orthodox church also uses the sign of the Cross, but they generally use three fingers and touch their right shoulder before their left shoulder. It has been stated that placing our hand on our forehead represents Heaven, touching our stomach represents earth, and touching our shoulder represents the place and sign of power. May the Lord bless you in the name of the Father, of the son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. St. Matthew taught his followers to make the sign of the Cross.
